
## **COTTON MARKET REPORT AS AT 1 MARCH 2013**

## **International**


The Cotlook A index (an indicator of world cotton lint prices) fluctuated within a relatively tight band of between 88 – 90 US/lb over the past month displaying no clear trend, whilst cotton futures have rebounded to a new ninemonth high amid fresh buying attributed mostly to funds and speculators.

According to the International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC) world cotton production will decline by about 14% to 22.6 million tons in 2013/14. The most significant declines are expected in the USA (-32%) and China (-20%). The ICAC expects that global cotton mill use will continue to grow slowly and increase by about 2% in 2013/14, supported by the small recovery in world economic growth. Most of the forecasted increase in cotton consumption for 2013/14 will originate from India and Pakistan. According to the ICAC, cotton mill use by China, the world's largest cotton consumer will drop by about 5% in 2013/14.

As reported previously by the ICAC, international cotton prices have benefited significantly from the cotton policies of the Chinese government. China, the largest cotton producer and consumer, is forecast to produce 7.3 million tons of cotton in 2012/13 (23% of the world production) and consume 8.3 million tons (36% of world cotton mill use) and also expected to hold about 47% of global cotton stock at the end of July 2013. the Chinese government Last season purchased over 3 million tons of cotton for state reserves at a price well above the world market price. Consequently, the gap between domestic and world prices triggered record imports contributing to a build-up of domestic stocks. According to the ICAC the Chinese cotton reserve continues to expand into this







season adding close to 6 million tons of cotton between September 2012 and January 2013 alone. It is estimated that two-thirds


of this year's cotton reserve purchases came from local production with the remaining third filled by imports.







## Local outlook

As far as the local outlook is concerned, the 2<sup>nd</sup> estimate for the 2012/13 production year indicates a total crop of 34 278 lint bales, up 7% from the 1<sup>st</sup> estimate but 46% down from the previous season. The decrease in the current crop is mainly due to the more favourable prospects for other competing

lint bales are estimated to be produced from RSA grown seed cotton, down 49% from the previous season. The balance of 3 500 lint bales relates to expected Swaziland produced cotton to be ginned by the Swaziland gin.
